



Most youth coming to Ranch Ehrlo have had little success in school. Frustration and failure have often led to anger or withdrawal. As a result, they are no longer interested in learning. To meet this challenge, the agency provides accredited, structured educational environments for academic assessment, modified programming, and behaviour stabilization in preparation for future educational placements.

Schaller Education Centre

Located on the Pilot Butte campus, this is a school for youth who are new to Ranch Ehrlo. It is designed to provide academic assessment, modified programs, and behavioural stabilization in preparation for future educational placements.

As students progress and their behaviours change, they are moved to classrooms in Regina schools under the supervision of a teacher and an assistant employed by the Ranch. This provides opportunity for students to adjust to what will be required in a regular school. The only difference in these classrooms is that the number of students is kept small in order to provide more individual attention to each student.

Transition program

This centre, located in Regina prepares youth to transition from their intake and stabilization classroom toward a mainstream placement. It also provides a more structural environment for youth

challenged with a more independent learning environment.

Ellen Gunn Education Centre

Located on the Corman Park campus, youth attend the school designed to provide academic assessment, modified academics, and behavioural stabilization in preparation for future educational placements. Following this placement, students are placed in Saskatoon schools appropriate to their age, academic capabilities, and specific treatment needs.

Hansen Education Centre

Youth new to Prince Albert programs attend Hansen Education Centre on the Buckland campus which provides academic assessment, modified programs, and behavioural stabilization. Following this, students are placed in classrooms operated by Ranch Ehrlo in Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division or are fully integrated appropriate to their age, academic capabilities, and specific treatment needs.

Day programs

School systems regularly access Ranch Ehrlo's services for students in their jurisdiction. These students, many of whom have behavioural problems, are placed at the Ranch in the day education program. This program provides educational services and may, if required, extend treatment services to the student's family. Corman Park campus also offers a day program for autistic students.



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Alternative education OPPORTUNITIES

Ranch Ehrlo offers person-centred educational opportunities and vocational programs for clients in Regina with developmental and cognitive disabilities in a warm, nurturing, and supportive environment.

Learning Centre

The Learning Centre is a special education program designed to meet the needs of young adults who have severe developmental disabilities and sensory needs.

It provides community-based services that maximize development, community inclusion, independence, and participants' contribution to the society in which they live. The participants are challenged to achieve their full potential for independence, productivity, right to enjoy life, and inclusion in the community. Programming involves developing an individualized plan which includes ongoing social and life skills development, and simple vocational training through constant, repetitive routines.

Life Skills Education Program

Ranch Ehrlo's Life Skills Education Program (LSEP), helps clients develop life skills and provides leisure and recreation opportunities, training, and skill development.

Vocational Training Employment Program

The focus for the Vocational Training Employment Program (VTEP) is on developing life skills, vocational training and skill development, and supervised vocational activities for our clients.

Supported Employment Program

The Supported Employment Program (SEP) offers clients employment opportunities and training.

Alternative Vocational Education Program

The Alternative Vocational Education Program (AVEP) provides vocational training and programming that promotes customized work experiences with ongoing supports. AVEP has been developed and designed to meet the needs of both male and female clients with sensory and communication issues, as well as supervision needs.

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
