Quick facts

- \$933,000 development located at 1747 Montreal St. in the heritage neighbourhood of Regina
- named Chaz Court after former board chair of Ehrlo Community Services, Dale Chastkiewicz
- project is designed for young singles transitioning from foster homes, group homes, or other transitional types of housing to independent living

Accommodation

- 8 single occupancy residential units
- tenants are between the ages of 16 and 25 years old. Currently, all tenants are attending school, and have plans to complete their Grade 12
- each unit is a studio style apartment, roughly 200-square feet, with built in beds and kitchenettes and a full bath

Tenant services

- the Ehrlo Housing team provides Chaz Court tenants with property management services, tenant relations, and opportunities to learn new skills related to living independently
- tenants at Chaz Court have a variety of outside community support persons/mentors in place to help them with living independently

The project

Ranch Ehrlo Society with the Government of Canada, the Province of Saskatchewan, and the City of Regina, broke ground on May 13, 2013 with a new housing development targeted towards youth in transition.

Chaz Court is designed to assist young singles transition from care; including foster, group or an institutional program to independent living.

These roughly 200-square feet, single occupancy apartments

provide affordable housing and allow people a greater amount of independence.

Tenants began moving in April 1, 2014 and the official ribbon cutting took place on June 17, 2014.

Ehrlo Housing operates as part of Ranch Ehrlo Society's community services and it provides affordable housing to low-income families, single mothers, individuals with chronic mental health conditions, and young people transitioning from care.
